## J. A. DONOHOE IS SUMMONED HERE THIS FORENOON

Another of Yankton's respected old citizens passed from the scene today in the death of James A.

Donohoe this forenoon at 9:35 o'clock. Mr. Donohoe, who was 90 years old on his last birthday in July, passed away at Sacred Heart hospital where he was taken Monday morning suffering a slight stroke.

The aged Yankton man had been quite active about his home and yard despite his advanced age, and was working on his lawn when he fell last

Saturday, and while he was able to be up and about the rest of that day and Sunday, it is believed his fall brought about the stroke sometime late Sunday or early Monday morning. Mr. Donohoe, besides maintaining an active interest in his home surroundings, also made regular trips downtown and was often seen visiting with old friends in the business district.

### Married 64 Years

Mr. and Mrs. Donohoe, who came to Yankton in 1912 from Iowa City, Iowa, were married February 20, 1882 and celebrated their sixtieth wedding anniversary in the company of family members and friends in 1942. They lived on a farm north of Yankton until 1935 when they retired and moved to their home at 1103 Douglas Avenue where they have continued to reside and where their anniversary observance was held four years ago.

Mr. Donohoe is survived by his widow and six children: Ella Donohoe who arrived yesterday from Chicago, Ann who was summoned home from a vacation and arrived yesterday, Mrs. Wm. Lyons who lives east of Yankton, and three sons, J. W. Donohoe, Francis A. Donohoe, and W. S. Donohoe, all of Yankton.

There is also one brother, J. H. Donohoe of Iowa City, Iowa, and a sister, Mrs. Alice Ryan of Dubuque, Iowa. They are expected to arrive, along with Mary Donohoe, a granddaughter from Chicago. Another granddaughter, Jane Donohoe, came yesterday from Sioux City.

The body has been taken to the Kabeiseman-Donohoe Funeral Home where arrangements were made yesterday for last rites to be read Friday at 9:30 a.m. The service will be conducted from Sacred Heart Catholic church to the family plot in the Catholic cemetery, and the Rev. Fr. Ladislaus Dudek will officiate. (Page 1)
